<p>Apart from the <i>main</i> repository we have now, I would like to propose a <i>testing</i> repository, too, where we deploy unstable / testing packages. The need was raised in AMARSi, where some of our packages will depend on packages of some partner's <i>testing</i> packages/repository. But I even think, this could make sense for our core packages, maybe even all our non-release (trunk) packages. The positive effect would be that users would have to actively decide on using testing packages and would now that they have to be prepared for changes, API breaks, and stuff.</p> <p>This would probably require slightly adapting our CI upload policies, e. g. to push packages to</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">- upload/main/\${ubuntu_release} and- upload/testing/\${ubuntu_release} <p>(currently just upload/\${ubuntu_release})</p>
